Inspection conducted by Elizabeth Wainwright.

A Missouri Department of Agriculture official attempted an inspection of the above named facility on this date.

Please see attempted inspection report for RQ 5734 also housed on the same property for details of attempted inspection.

The following violations were noted on this inspection:

1. Odor in the cat housing area. While the odor has been reduced substantially, there was still a significant odor. This may be related to the multiple piles of bloody diarrhea throughout the area.
2. Sick animals must be quarantined in an area physically separated from healthy animals. There was a Scottish Fold cat housed in the group facility that was sneezing. No isolation mechanism was in place.
3. 3 cats housed inside the house in the "Tokyo" cage did not have sufficient space to meet requirements.
4. There are 2 sick cats currently housed on the property: Frank (bloody diarrhea) and the Scottish Fold (sneezing). Frank is housed in a "Tokyo" cage in the cat housing area. There was a bloody diarrhea throughout the cat housing area that, per Mr. Hildebrant, is from Frank. There was a significant accumulation of fecal matter in the cage housing Frank as well. Per Mr. Hildebrant, he thinks Frank has been seen by a veterinarian, and the licensee, Ms. Baker, is currently treating him with Flagyl. He was unable to confirm.

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The Scottish Fold was sneezing while inspectors were present in the cat housing area.

*****Both of the animals listed above must be seen by the licensee's attending veterinarian within 48 hours of this notice. Once seen, the veterinary treatment records must be forwarded to the ACFA office. If animals have been examined and treatment initiated in the previous 48 hours, those treatment records will be acceptable in place of a new examination. Please note - failure to provide adequate medical care for animals is a violation of RSMo 578.**

5. The animals had no or limited bedding as required due to outside temperatures.

6. The cat housing area had a significant accumulation of greasy organic material and fecal matter. This must be cleaned more often.
